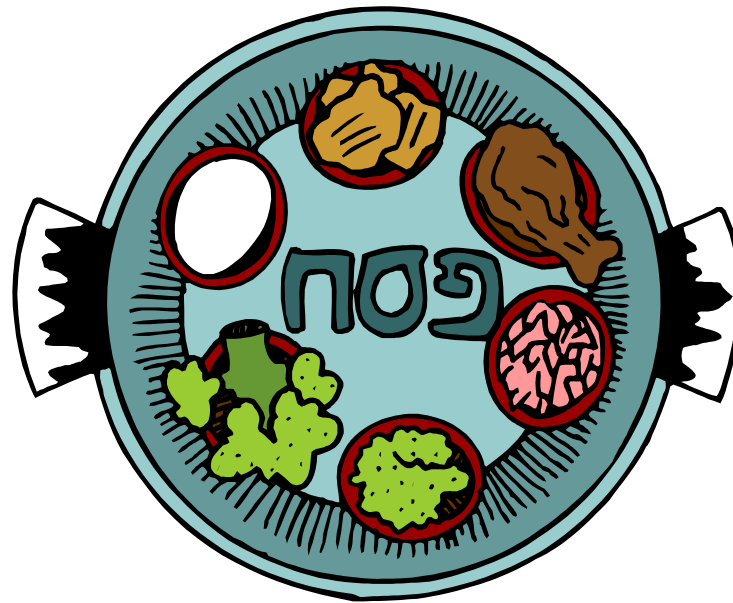

The *afikomen* is a special piece of *matzah* that is hidden on Passover. One of the ways we have fun celebrating Passover is by helping find the *afikomen*.



On Passover we eat many different kinds of food!
There will be chocolate-covered matzah, sweet charoset,
and healthy snacks to eat at the end of the service.
